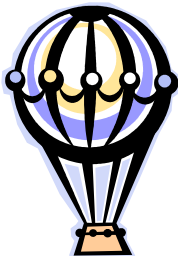
You are: Noam Chomsky

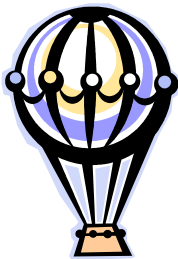

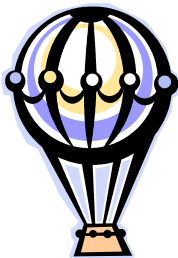

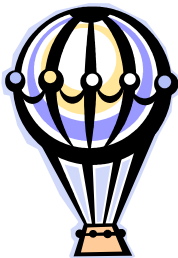
